Fellow Velo Holiday Availability

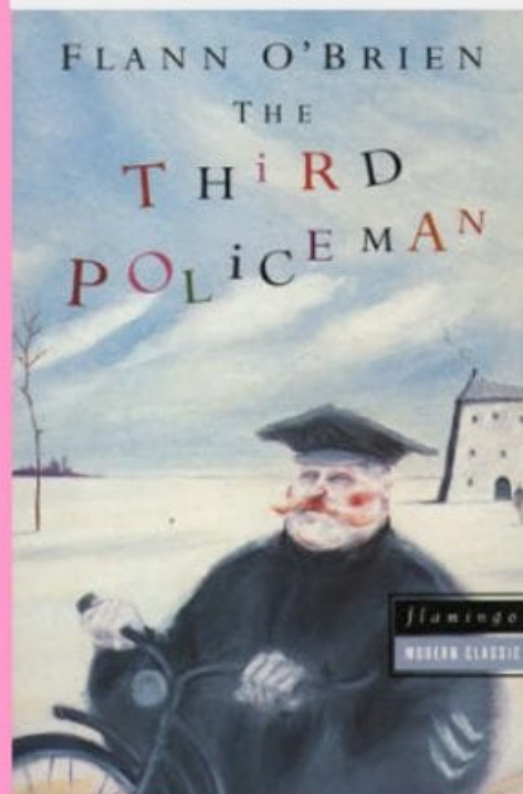
Our cycling season calendar is booking up but, we still have some dates available, particularly in Provence in September and October.
