For France, the Tour is so much more than just a bike race; its approach for weeks ahead of its arrival becomes the focal point of towns and villages along the route.



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We started up the run and we walked up the steep climb too. We sought shade and we shared our refreshments. We were showered with gifts by the Carpentier then, we were showered again. We looked down with them more and on the road as we shared the stage. We shared the roadside with more than 12 million spectators and... we had a fantastic experience out of the saddle!
